9/11 National Day of Remembrance

Are you looking for a peaceful spot to reflect on the events and the aftermath of 9/11? The Eagle Nature Trail committee invites everyone to commemorate all of the people impacted by September 11, 2001. The trail is the perfect place for peaceful reflection.

The events of September 11, 2001, have been called the most devastating foreign attack on American soil since the attack on Pearl Harbor in 1941. The attack echoes through 16 years to the present day because the United States continues in a fight against terrorism.

Look for our 7 Memorial Trees



The trees are marked by an engraved plaque and fencing. Each tree honors a group caught in the events of September 11, 2001.

Four of the memorial trees are located along the boardwalk area leading to the pond; three others are near the outdoor classroom area.

These special trees were grown from the seed of the swamp white oaks at the World Trade Center Memorial in New York City.

Wander our short trail surrounded by a prairie and small woodland. Head to the boardwalk leading to the small pond. Sit for a while on a bench or at the outdoor classroom and find comfort surrounded by nature.
