The Town of Mukwonago Police Department along with the Village of Mukwonago Police Department, the City of Muskego Police Department, and the Village of Eagle Police Department have been targeted by the WI Department of Transportation, Bureau of Traffic Safety (BOTS) for High Visibility Enforcement grants. BOTS targets local police departments for traffic enforcement grants based on traffic crash data. Based on their data, they have awarded our agencies a Traffic Passenger Safety Enforcement grant in the amount of \$25,000. Together, we will conduct high visibility deployments, targeting speeding, seatbelt usage, operating while intoxicated offenses, and aggressive driving. Our goal is to reduce the number of traffic crashes in our communities by targeting the above traffic violations. The deployments began in November 2017 and run through September 2018.

We would like to take this opportunity to remind drivers to slow down, leave plenty of space when following another vehicle, always wear your seat belt and never get behind the wheel if you are impaired. We also encourage all drivers to avoid distractions, including cell phone usage while driving. If we see you violating traffic laws for these types of activities, we will stop you and cite you.
