Fire Chief

Overview

The newly formed Kettle Moraine Fire District (a rural, combination department located in the communities of Eagle WI and North Prairie WI) is seeking candidates for the position of a full-time Fire Chief. The Fire Chief is the executive in charge of overseeing the Kettle Moraine Fire District, as well as an emergency responder who actively responds to EMT and Fire calls. The Fire Chief will be an experienced, innovative, and collaborative leader with demonstrated managerial, interpersonal, departmental planning and organizational skills. Successful candidates will demonstrate a commitment to the department and Municipal organizations – with a major focus on succession planning, mentoring, and staff development. The Fire Chief is expected to build and maintain strong professional relationships within the Fire Department and with the Municipal Boards, and to have a passion for service to the district's residents, businesses, and community organizations. The Fire Chief is responsible for the overall management and leadership of all fire and EMT functions including the strategy development, hiring, promotions, transfers, terminations, and staff recognition. Work involves responsibility for the efficient operation of the Fire Department to assure that firefighting, emergency medical, hazardous material mitigation, extrication, water rescue and other technical rescue services are provided to the residents of the district. Work also involves consulting with Fire Board officials in determining overall plans and policies to be followed in conducting fire operations, administration of the fire and medical response programs, open flame permits, mutual aid participation and drafting and following the district's annual budget. Work is performed with wide latitude in interpreting and applying policies, rules, and regulations; work performance is measured by total results obtained. The fire chief will work closely with the Fire Board; as well gives reports to the Municipal Boards and interacts with local, state, and federal fire authorities and regulatory agencies, as necessary. The Fire Chief also participates and assists with an annual financial audit of the district. The Fire Chief reports to the Fire Board.

Minimum Requirements for Application

- Minimum of five years in a leadership role (e.g., Captain, District Chief/Battalion, Division Chief or Chief) with demonstrated success within a fire service agency.
- Pattern of progressive achievement throughout his/her career.
- Associate degree in Fire Science or in a related Field or equivalent in experience and training or bachelor's degree preferably with emphasis in Fire Science, Emergency Management, Leadership, Public Administration, or closely related field.
- Effective oral and written communication skills
- Active listening skills
- Ability to assess and evaluate situations effectively
- Ability to identify critical issues quickly and accurately
- Attention to detail
- Ability to mediate conflict with tact, diplomacy
- Subject to a drug screen to the extent permitted by law

- Must be able to work in temperature ranges from moderate to extreme cold and heat; in confined spaces as defined by OSHA, walk, stand, run, and sit
- Demonstrated competency in strategic planning and execution (ensuring mission, vision and values drive the organization), financial planning, and staff development founded in outstanding interpersonal skills.
- Experience in an urban fire service agency or comparable experience.
- Certified or ability to be certified as Fire Officer II as defined in NFPA.
- Possession and maintenance of a valid driver's license.
- Employee must live within 20 miles of the coverage limits of the Kettle Moraine Fire District following employment.

- Master's Degree preferred
- Experience in an accredited Fire Department
- Management/leadership training such as: National Fire Academy Executive Fire Officer Program or Chief Fire Officer designation from the Center for Public Safety Excellence, Commission on Professional Credentialing; FEMA National Incident Management System courses
